September 13, 20, 27, October 4 from 6:30-7:30 PM

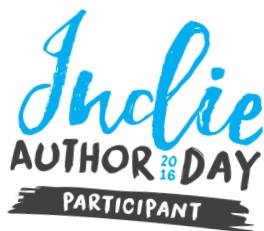
This four-week class introduces participants to the joy of making music on the ukulele. Known as the people's instrument this accessible instrument is built for success with minimal instruction.

## LIBRARY TRUSTEES

The Board of Library Trustees will be sponsoring two articles on the Fall Town Meeting warrant. One article seeks the approval of the townspeople to allow the Library Trustees to apply for, receive, and expend a construction grant from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. The other article seeks the approval of the townspeople for the proposed new library facility schematic drawing and site selection.
