

Babysitter Training Course

Tuesday April 19th and Thursday April 21st from 1-5pm

This course is for teens/tweens ages 11 and older, designed by the 4-H Youth Development Program of the UMass Extension to teach responsible babysitting. Course includes: Child safety/first aid, feeding, discipline, entertainment, and the business side of babysitting. The cost is \$35 per participant (cost of manual and completion certificate) and training will be held at the library over the course of two days (attendance at both sessions is required).
