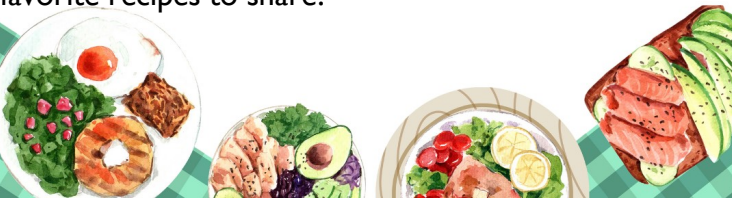
Cookbook Club

No specific cookbook this month, make one of your favorite recipes to share!

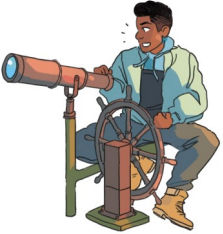

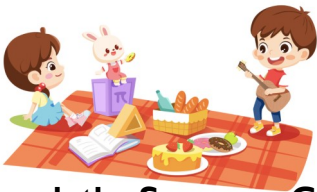
