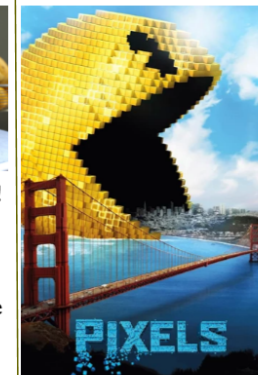
### Quick Pickling Workshop
