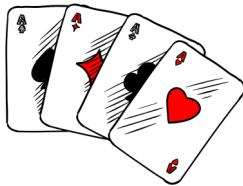
Chain of Lights with special guest: The Grinch!

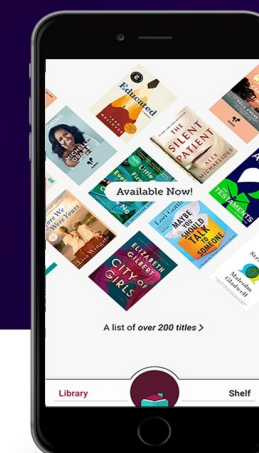
